SPRING SPORTS SUCCESS

Arcadia's athletic teams capped off the most successful year in school history with an outstanding spring season. The Men's Tennis team won the Pennsylvania Athletic Conference (PAC) title and the Baseball team advanced to the conference championship game. On the women's side, the Softball team advanced to the PAC playoffs for the fifth time in six years.

The Men's Tennis team finished the season with a 7-0 record, including a heart-stopping 4-3 win over league rival Cabrini in the final week of the season. It was the first conference championship for the men in program history and only the second for any Arcadia men's team in school history (the first was for Soccer, 2001). Two singles players and two doubles teams won the conference tournament in their categories.

The Baseball Team compiled a 25-17 mark this year, recording its best season ever. The Knights earned their first-ever playoff berth and victory, and finished one game shy of the NCAA tournament. Stan Exeter was named PAC Coach of the Year and three players earned spots on the all-conference team.

The Softball Team also advanced to the playoffs, losing in the first round. The Knights, who finished with a 23-18 record, did have conference Rookie of the Year (Cyndia Lukomski), and three players earned first-team all-conference honors.

In addition, Jenn Szeker (Tennis, Basketball and Softball) and Ben Swan were named Outstanding Female and Male Senior Athlete. Szeker was named to the all-conference team in all three sports while Swan was a Regional All-American in 2001 as the Men's Soccer team advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.
