"Exploring Franklin's World"

While many of Franklin's inventions improved the quality of life for individuals, many of his innovations had an even broader social impact. Public libraries, fire departments, postal services, public education, and public hospitals are all rooted in Franklin's philosophy of a comfortable and equitable society.

After the lecture, take a shuttle bus to Philadelphia or go to the Morris Arboretum to explore Franklin's world.

Bus Tour to Philadelphia

11 a.m.–4 p.m. Spend the afternoon at one of three historic landmarks.

(Boxed lunch provided. Shuttle Bus: \$18. Entrance fees on your own.)

1. The National Constitution Center: Benjamin Franklin is the only founding father to have signed all four historical revolutionary documents: the Declaration of Independence, the Treaty with France, the Treaty with England and the U.S. Constitution. The National Constitution Center explains the U.S. Constitution through high-tech exhibits, artifacts and interactive displays.

2. Franklin Institute: Celebrate Ben's 300th birthday by exploring the permanent exhibit, *Franklin...He's Electric!*, which highlights Franklin's natural curiosity and scientific genius from meteorology and music to electricity, optics and aquatics.

(\$13.95; \$11 seniors and children 4–11; under 4 free)

3. Franklin Court: The life and accomplishments of Ben Franklin are celebrated in this museum complex. (free)

Morris Arboretum: "Medicinal Herbs in Colonial Times"

1–4 p.m. at the Morris Arboretum

Learn about the medicinal herbs and remedies that were used in Colonial times and walk through the herb gardens at the Morris Arboretum. Take a boxed lunch to the arboretum and enjoy an outdoor picnic in their café.
