



Transitional Summer Housing Information

All students enrolled in courses at the University or engaged in an academic pursuit for credit will reside in the Oak Summit Apartments during the summer. Students in the Physician Assistant program may use summer housing as transitional housing while looking for a more permanent residence. **Due to the fact that we are unable to extend your stay in transitional housing, the Office of Residence Life recommends that your permanent housing arrangements begin no later than August 1, 2008. Requests for summer housing are due to the Student Affairs Office by April 30th, 2008.**

Costs

Single occupancy \$170/week (1 or 2-bedroom apartment; 1 person per bedroom)

Double occupancy \$120/week (1-bedroom apartment; 2 people per bedroom)

Single occupancy \$1700 for the entire summer housing period, includes one free week stay (5/16-8/1)

Double occupancy \$1200 for the entire summer housing period, includes one free week stay (5/16-8/1)

Please note, single occupancy spaces are limited, while we will attempt to meet your preferences, you may be placed in a double occupancy space. Double occupancy is defined as two people in a one-bedroom apartment. Single occupancy is defined as one person per bedroom; you may be sharing an apartment.

One-bedroom apartments are allotted \$175/month for utilities. Students who exceed this monthly allotment may be billed for any overages. Two-bedroom apartments are allotted \$200/month for utilities. Students who exceed this monthly allotment may be billed for any overages.

Graduate students will be billed for the entire summer and will receive a prorated refund based on their check-out date.

Move-In Information:

Due to the University calendar this year, some apartments may not be available at the beginning of the summer session. Provided your assignment is ready, you may move into your apartment on Friday, May 16, 2008 or the Monday of the week your occupancy term begins.

Apartment Amenities:

Each bedroom has a bed, dresser, desk, and desk chair for each person. There is a kitchen table and chairs, couches, end table and coffee table located in each apartment. All apartments have a phone line, internet connection, cable TV connection, full kitchen, and air conditioning. Residents are responsible for providing all cleaning supplies, toiletries, linens, kitchen accoutrements, and additional lighting
