Dear Arcadia Students,

It has been an extremely busy summer, and we are looking forward to the start of the new academic year at Arcadia University. Activities for New Student Orientation begin on Friday, August 27, 2010 and classes begin on Wednesday, September 1. We are excited to share some of the highlights of the summer and some of the changes on campus. As always, we are focused on enhancing the experience for all students, and this includes upgrading facilities and making various campus improvements. We hope you will review all of the details in this newsletter to learn about the changes and let us know if you have questions. Please use MyArcadia ([my.arcadia.edu](http://my.arcadia.edu)) to get additional information or any last minute updates.

One of the most significant changes you will note upon your return to campus is the construction fencing around the Kuch Center field. This fencing will remain in place until fall 2011 when the University Commons project is completed. The Commons will add 50,000 square feet of space to the Kuch Center and provide much needed dining, meeting, lounge, fitness, and gallery space for students. We hope that you will make the Commons your "living room" on campus. We ask for your patience during the construction and that you familiarize yourself with the two main temporary routes you can use to navigate campus. Due to the Commons construction, athletic contests normally held on the Kuch field will now be held on the new field in front of the Castle. We hope that you also use the new field and the Castle lawn for recreational activities or just to hang out. Finally, the University Bookstore has relocated to its new home in the lower level of the Dining Complex - please be sure to visit!

Upgrades in University housing continued this summer as we added sprinklers in the A building of Oak Summit (we anticipate completing sprinkler installation in the B and C buildings next summer) and replaced all of the windows in the Manor Apartments.

There have been a few staffing changes in Student Affairs. Jan Walbert has transitioned from her role as Vice President for Student Affairs to Vice President of Development working in Arcadia University's Advancement Office. Jan has been an instrumental part of Student Affairs at Arcadia for the past 21 years and we will miss her! As a result of Jan's departure, I have been promoted to Associate Vice President for Student Affairs and Dean of Students and Dian Taylor-Alleyne has been promoted to Associate Dean of Students. Laura Bickert has left her position as Area Coordinator for Dilworth, Heinz, and Knight Halls and will assume the role of Housing Assistant within Residence Life. We are in the process of completing searches for a Director of Student Engagement to replace Dian and an Area Coordinator to replace Laura.

As always, the Resident Assistants and Commuter Assistants will be back on campus for training in mid August, preparing for new and returning students. Their dedication contributes to the overall experience of all students, and this training and networking is essential for their roles in supporting students. Every student has the benefit of connecting with faculty, staff and these significant student leaders. We hope you will utilize them as key resources in our community.

As we prepare to welcome all new and returning students, we want to remind new students and their families that it really helps you and the traffic flow if you enter campus through the Church Road entrances on move in day. This will make the arrival and related traffic flow on campus smoother and enhance your move-in experience.

Arcadia continues to be in the news for the quality of academic programs and the success of our students and alumni. Many events and celebrations are planned for this fall, so mark you calendars and plan to be involved. Enjoy the rest of your summer and be sure to bring your energy and enthusiasm to campus. We look forward to seeing you all very soon!

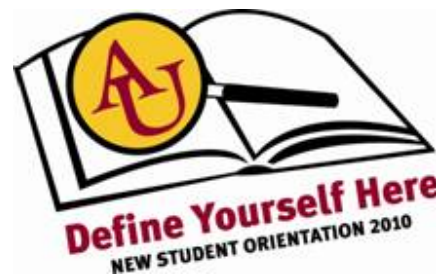
## NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION August 27 thru August 31

The Orientation staff is looking forward to welcoming new students and their families to campus on Friday, August 27 for our Fall program. Check-in on the 27th is in the Kuch Center between 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. It is recommended that resident students arrive by 10:00 a.m. and that commuter students arrive around 10:00 a.m.; however, we will be happy to help you whenever you arrive. Programs for students and their families begin at 11:30 a.m. The Orientation events scheduled for new students are intended to help you become a member of our community, and we encourage you to take full advantage of them. Our goal is to enable you to feel comfortable with life at Arcadia when classes begin on September 1.

At check-in, new students will receive:

- First semester course schedule (or advising and testing appointments).
- Schedule of events for the Fall Orientation program.
- ID card (or have photo taken for ID).
- Residence hall room key – resident students will pay \$5 Residence Hall Council dues at check-in.
- Interested commuter students will receive a room key for Orientation. A \$10 deposit is required at check-in. The deposit will be returned on Sunday morning upon the return of your key to a Commuter Assistant. Due to limited space, commuter students interested in staying on campus during Orientation should contact the Student Affairs Office at (215) 572-2933 **no later than August 13th**.

## REGISTRATION

Fall semester classes begin on Wednesday, September 1, 2010 as early as 8:15 a.m. If you have not registered, we recommend that you do so as soon as possible. Please contact your adviser for an appointment.

**Returning students** may view fall course schedules (including classroom assignments) online via Self Service from this link: <https://selfservice.arcadia.edu/selfservice>. Classroom assignments are subject to change - please check your class schedule a day or two before classes begin. **New students** will receive fall schedule information at orientation on August 27, and they may also access course information via the web.

If you wish to change a course, please complete a drop/add form. Tuesday, September 7, 2010 is the last day for adding courses without instructor approval (unless the course meets only on Monday evening, and in those cases the last day is Monday, September 13, 2010).

## ATTENTION SENIORS!

If you are planning to graduate with the Class of 2011, you must complete the Notification of Intent to Complete a Degree or Certificate form which is available in the Registrar's Office (Taylor Hall Room 103) or from the Forms link at [www.arcadia.edu/registrar](http://www.arcadia.edu/registrar).

In order to graduate, you must have completed the required amount of credits (120 credits minimum for an evening student; 128 credits minimum for a day student) and have fulfilled the necessary requirements for general education, as well as for your major, by the date of graduation (see course catalog for details). Outstanding transcripts from other colleges/universities should be sent to the Arcadia University Registrar's Office as soon as possible.

It is strongly recommended that you meet with your adviser prior to course registration to be sure you are completing final requirements needed for your degree. **It is ultimately the responsibility of the student to meet degree requirements** so it is important that you review your own transcript and credits to be sure you are eligible to graduate.

If your intent is to graduate in August or December 2011, but you wish to walk with the Class of 2011 in May, you may petition to do so. Arcadia University policy states that an undergraduate student missing only one course (3 to 4 credits) may petition to walk in May's ceremony. A petition may be picked up in the Registrar's Office and should be returned to the Office of Undergraduate Studies (Taylor Room 105). Watch your mailbox for information about ordering commencement attire!

## VOTER REGISTRATION

In compliance with the 1998 Higher Education Act, Voter Registration Applications are available in the Student Affairs office for new residents and commuters from Pennsylvania. Resident students can use either their campus address to vote while at school, their home address to vote from home, or can vote via absentee ballot. You may also visit [www.dos.state.pa.us/voting/site](http://www.dos.state.pa.us/voting/site) to download the application.

## CAMPUS BOOKSTORE

Hours of operation are:

- Mon-Thurs, 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- Saturday, 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

Hours are extended at the beginning of each semester. Payment methods accepted: cash, credit cards (Visa, Master Card, Discover, American Express), and debit cards.

**All returns must be accompanied with a valid receipt.** New and used textbooks may be returned for a full refund within seven (7) days of purchase.

Checks up to \$50 may be cashed by students with a valid student ID and social security number.

## PARKING ON CAMPUS

Commuter students and upper class resident students wishing to park on campus must register their vehicles with the Public Safety Office. Your vehicle registration card, driver's license and current hangtag (if one was previously issued) are required to obtain a parking permit/validation sticker.

Students pay \$60 for a parking permit which is valid for the entire year; parking permits for one semester are \$30. If a permit is only needed for the fall semester, the full year rate (\$60) must be paid; \$30 will be refunded if the permit is returned to Public Safety before December 31st. Students will be charged \$5 to replace lost/stolen parking permits. During the first week of classes, citations for No Valid Parking Permit Displayed will not be issued, however **all other violations will be enforced.**

Visitor spaces are reserved for those visiting campus offices and departments and are not for use by guests of students. All guests of students need to obtain a temporary parking permit, available at the Public Safety Office or at the Castle. Hosts are responsible for their guests' parking and fines. Appeal forms for citations issued by the Public Safety staff are available at the Castle reception desk and at the Public Safety Office in Dilworth Hall. Questions regarding parking may be directed to the Public Safety Office at (215) 572-2800.

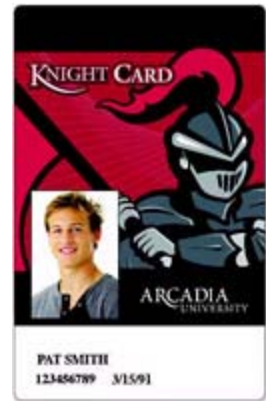
**First-Year resident students** are not permitted to have vehicles on campus. If you have extenuating circumstances and wish to request an exemption, please contact Catherine Mattingly, Director of Residence Life, in writing via e-mail at [mattingly@arcadia.edu](mailto:mattingly@arcadia.edu). Appropriate documentation may be required for an exception. Your vehicle may not be parked on campus until you receive notification of approval.

## ID CARDS

Your ID card can be used to provide access to residence halls and to access your meal plan at the Dining Hall. You must carry your Arcadia University ID card at all times while on campus, and you must present it to any Arcadia University staff member who requests to see it. The replacement charge for lost/stolen or damaged ID cards is \$15.00. If your ID card is defaced you may be directed by Student Affairs staff or Public Safety staff to have the card replaced. New undergraduate students will receive their Knight cards during New Student Orientation in August.

The Arcadia University Knight Card gives students, faculty, and staff the ability to use their card as a PNC debit card if linked to a PNC checking account. To link your Knight Card to PNC, please visit your PNC account gateway or your local branch office.

In the Fall of 2010, all full-time undergraduate students who have account balances below \$2,500 will have their student IDs validated. A validated ID permits students to: charge items at the Bookstore and at the Chat to their student account, access and utilize gym facilities, and check out reference and other materials from the Landman Library. To opt out of charging privileges, log in to MyArcadia, click on the Campus tab and then on the "Student Charging Privileges: Opt Out" link in the One-Stop Shop Student Info module.



## ONE STOP SHOP

Arcadia University's **One-Stop Shop** is located on the ground floor of Taylor Hall.

The One-Stop Shop staff can answer questions and assist students with resolving issues related to Campus Work Study, billing, and financial aid. You may visit the One-Stop Shop to submit payments toward your student account, pay for parking permits, submit room and registration deposits, purchase movie tickets, and access the Student Information System. The One-Stop Shop is also the place to go on campus when you're not sure of where else to go, or if you just need general information.

The One-Stop Shop offers student-friendly hours of operation:

- Monday-Thursday, 8:30 a.m.-7:00 p.m.
- Friday, 8:30 a.m.-5:00 p.m.

## LIBRARY AND INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

### LANDMAN LIBRARY

Landman Library provides access to 45 online databases, 14,000 electronic journals and 48,000 e-books that can be viewed from any computer on or off campus. We also have over 100,000 print books, including a leisure-reading collection as well as roughly 2,000 videos and DVDs. Library space includes a well-lit, comfortable atmosphere for leisure reading as well as quiet areas for solitary study on both the Main and Second levels. In addition, the lower level is complete with moveable tables, chairs and white boards, which are perfect for collaborative study. Reference Librarians are available at the Reference desk or by appointment to answer your questions and to assist at all levels of the research process.

### INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

Arcadia's campus-wide wireless network provides full coverage in all academic buildings, residence halls, and administrative areas as well as areas in which students congregate such as the Walk of Pride and outside of Landman Library. Please note that in order to obtain network or Internet access you will be asked to register your computer to determine if the computer has met the appropriate security standards as set forth by the University. ## CAMPUS WORK STUDY

Students who received a Campus or Institutional Work-Study allocation as part of their financial aid package are eligible for on-campus employment. Placement is not guaranteed and is based upon availability of positions and timely receipt of applications.

New and returning students who have been placed in an on-campus job must attend one of two training sessions to review work study policies on **Tuesday, August 31**, in Stiteler Auditorium. The sessions are offered at 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. **Plan to attend!**

Students who are placed in positions must come to the One-Stop Shop in Taylor Hall to complete payroll documents. These forms are necessary in order for you to receive a paycheck. Please bring your passport OR driver's license *and* social security card (a birth certificate can be substituted for a social security card). **Originals are required.** Copies will be made of these documents at the One-Stop Shop. Student employees can have their paychecks placed directly into their bank accounts using direct deposit. Information regarding direct deposit can be obtained at the training session or at the One-Stop Shop. The Direct Deposit Form for Campus Work Study employees can be completed online through MyArcadia under the One-Stop Shop Student Info Module.

## CAREER DEVELOPMENT

Shortly after the graduation ceremonies in May, chain link fences and limited access to many buildings became the norm on campus. Just after that, heavy equipment and clouds of dust also became a staple of life at Arcadia. None of these changes are particularly appealing but when the new University Commons opens in 2011, these challenges and inconveniences will have been well worth it. In reality, the construction plan that has brought havoc to our usually quiet campus has little to do with Career Development. But if you will allow me some latitude, I think this project serves as a terrific metaphor for how effective career planning can pay off in the end.

Like the campus, the job market isn't pretty right now – unemployment continues to hover around 10%, salaries are down, job growth is non-existent. And similar to a construction project, investing in a college education during an economic downturn requires that you attack the challenge with a clear plan. So how do you make the most of your Arcadia education and experience to assure success after graduation? The staff of Career Development has a few suggestions:

- **Start early!** All students should clarify their interests, key skills, and career-related values early in their academic experience. This helps with selecting an appropriate major, identifying career alternatives, and developing a vision for where an Arcadia degree will lead you.
- **Get experience!!** Whether through internship, volunteer or co-curricular experiences, it's very important that you have something to list on your resume that will help you market your skills to potential employers or graduate programs.
- **Get going!!!** Waiting until the last minute to start the steps above only serves to put you behind your competition. Graduating seniors especially, should get a jump on their job search or graduate school applications since top candidates are often hired or admitted well ahead of graduation.

Regardless of your year or situation, the Career Development staff can help you create a plan to beat a challenging economy. A strong plan can transform your education into career success, just as the current construction plan will ultimately transform the campus! ## MULTICULTURAL AFFAIRS

## THE OFFICE OF ACADEMIC DEVELOPMENT

### THE LEARNING RESOURCE NETWORK (LRN)

The Learning Resource Network (LRN) is part of the office of Academic Development located in Knight Hall. LRN offers peer tutoring for most subjects and help with academic reading and study skills. Students can drop in for tutoring in the basement of the library or to request a one-on-one tutor. Our LRN Lab in Knight Hall has four networked PCs, in addition to many resources including CDs and DVDs to help improve study skills. ### DISABILITIES SUPPORT SERVICES (DSS)

Disabilities Support Services (DSS) is part of the office of Academic Development. DSS provides services and coordinates accommodations for students with disabilities. All students requiring special services due to a physical or other disability affecting learning should contact **Linda Pizzi, Director of Academic Development** at (215) 572-4086, at least three weeks before the start of the semester. Students are required to provide documentation pertaining to the disability in order to receive any accommodations. The staff will discuss reasonable and appropriate accommodations with students and assist students in arranging accommodations. Any information discussed will be strictly confidential. Students are not required to reveal a disability unless accommodations are requested. Arcadia University also provides a variety of accommodations for people with disabilities who attend events at the University. Please contact the office of Academic Development for more information and to make arrangements. (A minimum of two weeks notice may be necessary for some arrangements.)

## IMPORTANT PARKING INFORMATION FOR RESIDENT STUDENTS

### KNIGHT HALL RESIDENTS

Knight Hall residents who have a valid Arcadia parking hangtag may park in any appropriate Arcadia residential lot. Knight Hall residents who wish to park in the Knight/Manor/Oak Summit lot (parking lot #1) must present their validated Arcadia parking hangtag at the Public Safety Office to receive a Knight Hall parking sticker. Parking in Lot #1 is reserved for residents of Manor, Oak Summit, and Knight and is available on a first-come, first-served basis. If you are unable to find a space in Lot #1, you may park in any other student space on campus.



### MANOR APARTMENT RESIDENTS

**General Policy**—Residents of the Manor may park in any space at the Manor complex provided they are displaying a validated Manor hangtag.

1. How do I get a validated Manor hangtag?

You will be able to purchase/renew your Arcadia Manor hangtag at returning student check-in at the Kuch Center on Monday, August 30 and Tuesday, August 31.

The cost to purchase/renew your hangtag is \$60.00 for the 2010-2011 academic year. Please be sure to bring your driver's license, insurance card, and vehicle registration with you. Manor residents arriving early (campus life staff, athletes, orientation staff) should park in the Manor lot and may purchase/renew their hangtag during returning student check-in. If you are arriving after August 31, you may purchase/renew your Arcadia Manor hangtag at the Public Safety Office in Dilworth Hall.



2. What happens if the Manor lot is full? Where can I park?

All Manor residents who have a Manor hangtag may park in Lot #1 – the parking lot adjacent to Knight Hall. Parking in Lot #1 is reserved for residents of Manor, Oak Summit, and Knight and is available on a first-come, first-served basis. If you are unable to park in Lot #1, you may park in any other student space on campus. Please make sure your Manor hangtag is properly displayed on your rearview mirror when parking in any University parking lots.

### OAK SUMMIT APARTMENT RESIDENTS

**General Policy**—Residents of Oak Summit may park in the **yellow**-lined spaces at the Oak Summit complex provided they are displaying a validated Oak Summit hangtag.

1. How do I get a validated Oak Summit hangtag?

You will be able to purchase/renew your Arcadia Oak Summit hangtag at returning student check-in in the Kuch Center on Monday, August 30 and Tuesday, August 31.

The cost to purchase/renew your hangtag is \$60.00 for the 2010-2011 academic year. Please be sure to bring your driver's license, insurance card, and vehicle registration with you. Oak Summit residents arriving early (campus life staff, athletes, orientation staff) should park in the Oak Summit lot and may purchase/renew their hangtag during returning student check-in. If you are arriving after August 31, you may purchase/renew your Arcadia Oak Summit hangtag at the Public Safety Office in Dilworth Hall.



2. What happens if the Oak Summit lot is full? Where can I park?

All Oak Summit residents who have an Oak Summit hangtag may park in Lot #1 – the parking lot adjacent to Knight Hall. Parking in Lot #1 is reserved for residents of Manor, Oak Summit, and Knight and is available on a first-come, first-served basis. If you are unable to park in Lot #1, you may park in any other student space on campus. Please make sure your Oak Summit hangtag is properly displayed on your rearview mirror when parking in any University parking lots.

3. May I park on the streets neighboring Oak Summit?

Students may park their cars on Limekiln Pike in designated parking areas. Students should not park their cars on Springhouse Road, Oak Road, Harrison Avenue, and Royal Avenue. Resident students who park their cars on these streets may receive a citation from Public Safety.


## RESIDENCE LIFE

## LAUNDRY

Washers and dryers in all University housing are available to resident students **free of charge!** Students do not need to purchase a laundry card to use the machines.

## APPLIANCES

Students are permitted to have microwave ovens and refrigerators in their rooms. Students may bring their own refrigerators, provided they are no larger than 3.2 cubic feet. **Due to safety, liability and insurance requirements regarding size and power supply, all microwaves must be rented through the University vendor and no microwaves are permitted in the Castle.** Common area microwaves are provided for Castle residents.

The Student Government Organization (SGO) sponsors microwave and refrigerator rentals through QPS Marketing. ## TELEVISION

A satellite cable system connection is provided in each residence hall room and apartment. Students must have a cable-ready TV set and a cable to plug into both the cable outlet and the TV set. Cables are generally available in stores that sell consumer electronics. The television setting should be on "cable", not on antenna and students must auto-program the TV in order to get all channels. ## RHC DUES

## UNIVERSITY HOUSING AGREEMENT

At check-in, all students will be required to read and sign the University Housing Agreement. Adherence to the University Housing Agreement is extremely important for managing the residence halls and apartments and for developing a positive community. Your cooperation and compliance with all aspects of the Agreement is essential. Violations of the Agreement will be adjudicated through the campus disciplinary system.

## GUESTS

All resident students are fully responsible for their guests' actions. Where appropriate, all guests must sign in with the desk receptionist. Resident students and their guests are expected to fully cooperate with desk receptionists and other University staff. If children under twelve years of age are visiting a residence hall for more than three hours, the Area Coordinator must be notified in advance.

## TELEPHONES

Arcadia University provides one telephone jack in each residence hall room. There is no sign-up fee and no charge for this service. Students must bring a telephone if they wish to make or receive calls. Students can receive calls (with the exception of collect calls) in their rooms. Calls can be made to anywhere on campus using 4-digit dialing of any campus extension. Calling card calls and 800 number calls are no charge.

Resident students will need a calling card or a magicJack (or similar device) to make outgoing calls from residence hall rooms.

## RESIDENT CHECK-IN

- We encourage all arriving residential students to enter campus from Church Road and proceed to Kuch Center for check-in as noted below. Exiting traffic may only go right (South) on Easton Road from the Castle.
- Please note: All financial obligations (previous and current bills) must be paid prior to check-in. Room keys, ID cards, and meal validations will not be issued without the approval of the Business Office.

## MAIL/PRINT/FAX SERVICES

**Kevin Jones**, site manager, and the staff of Document Technologies Inc. will happily and efficiently assist customers with all mail and print needs.

The Campus Post Office is located on the ground floor of the Dining Hall Complex next to the Chat. Students can purchase stamps, mail packages and send/receive faxes during the window hours—weekdays, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Students have a choice to pay for these services using cash or by charging to their student ID.

**Student ID charges must have a minimum \$5.00 purchase.**

Fax charges are determined per page for both incoming and outgoing faxes (\$.50 domestic; \$1.00 international). The number to receive faxes is (215) 572-8542. For further information call Mail Services at (215) 572-2164, 2109 or 8550.

A new system has been implemented that will now notify students via e-mail when a package has arrived for them. "Call for Parcel" slips will no longer be placed in student mailboxes. The contents of the e-mail will have the student's name, time package arrived, package carrier (UPS, FedEx, and USPS), tracking number, and sender of the package.

Once the student signs for the package, an email will be generated saying that the package has successfully been delivered. Students should get this email within two hours after pick up.

Students will not have the same mailbox every year—each academic year, any returning student will have a different mailbox than the one from the previous year. Students can pick up their new assignment at Mail and Print Services.

Mail and Print Services cannot forward mail to a student's home address. After the academic year is over, we suggest that students change their address back to their home address for any mail they want to continue to receive during the summer.

All first class mail and packages will be returned to the sender if mail is unclaimed. The USPS prohibits mail to be forwarded from a temporary address (Arcadia) to a permanent address (home).

## TAXI CAB TRANSPORTATION BETWEEN ARCADIA AND ABINGTON MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

Resident students that need non-emergency medical attention but do not have transportation may use pre-paid taxi vouchers for a round trip between Arcadia University and Abington Memorial Hospital. Taxi service will be provided by Buxmont Transport Company between the hours of 5:00 a.m. and midnight, seven days a week. Vouchers will be available between 8:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. at the Student Affairs Office in Knight Hall, the Wellness Center on the ground floor of Heinz Hall, and at the Public Safety Office in Dilworth Hall. Between the hours of 5:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. to midnight, vouchers may be obtained by contacting Public Safety or the Residence Life Administrator on Duty. The cost of the round trip fare between Arcadia University and Abington Memorial Hospital (including gratuity) is \$34.00 and will be charged to the student's account.

Students needing medical attention between midnight and 5:00 a.m. or experiencing a medical emergency at any time should contact Public Safety or the Residence Life Administrator on Duty at x2999.
