

**Act 80 of 2018 Hazing Report  
Arcadia University  
January 1, 2022**

**Reporting Period: 2017-2018, 2018-2019, 2019-2020 and 2020-2021  
and 2021-2022**

This report is published in accordance with Act 80 of 2018, the Timothy J. Piazza Anti-Hazing Law, 18 Pa.C.S. § 2809 *et seq.* Act 80 requires the University to maintain a report of all violations of the University’s Anti-Hazing Policy (or of Federal or State laws related to hazing) that are reported to the University. For purposes of this Report, “violations” means those instances where a student(s), a Student Organization(s), or a person associated with a Student Organization was alleged to have violated the University’s Anti-Hazing Policy (or *alleged to* have violated Federal or State laws related to hazing and reported to the University). The University will update the report bi-annually on January 1 and August 1 of each year.
