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
Fall-to-Fall Retention of First-Year Students

The graph below examines fall-to-fall retention rates for first-year student (first-time full-time undergraduate) students by entering cohort at Arcadia University from fall 2010 to fall 2019. The Fall 2012 cohort remains Arcadia's strongest cohort to date, with a 1-yr retention rate of 85.4%. Subsequent cohorts have maintained an average 1-yr retention rate of 78.1%.

- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2013 2019 = 78.1%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2013 2018 = 69.8%
- Average fall to fall 3rd to 4th year retention 2013 2017 = 62.7%

The largest drop in fall-to fall retention typically occurs between the first and second year. From the second to third year, cohorts shrink an average of 10.3%. From third to fourth year, cohorts shrink an average of 9.5%. In combination, attrition in the second and third year is an average of 18.8%, and rivals that of the first year (21.2%). In each of the last six years, Arcadia has retained approximately 2/3 of each First-year Student cohort through the start of their 4th year.


Gender & Retention

The chart below examines year-to-year retention rates for First-Year Student cohorts by gender from fall 2010 to fall 2019. Historical data shows that male students are more likely to retain at a lower rate than female students. On average, female students are retained from first to second year at a rate 2.3% higher than male students. By the third year, the gender gap in retention grows to an average of 4.3%.



- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: Women = 79.5%
- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: All = 78.4%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: Men = 69.1%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: Women = 72.1%

Gender & 1, 2, & 3-Year Retention Rates


Retained Year 1 to Year 2



Race Ethnicity & Retention


The chart below examines year-to-year retention rates for First-Year Student cohorts based on self-reported race ethnicity data. These data include First-Year Student cohorts entering fall 2010 through fall 2019. For the purposes of this analysis, Underrepresented Minority includes the following race/ethnicity categories: Hispanic, American Indian/Alaska Native, Black/Non-Hispanic, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, and Multiple Ethnicities. As shown below, Underrepresented Minority students have lower retention rates compared to White/Asian students. On average, White/Asian students were retained from 1st to 2nd year at a rate of 5.5 percentage points higher than Underrepresented Minority students. By Year 3, that gap grows to an average of 9 percentage points.

- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: Underrepresented Minority = 75.0%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: Underrepresented Minority = 65.2%
- Average fall to fall 3rd to 4th year retention 2010 2017: Underrepresented Minority = 57.8%
- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: White/Asian= 80.5%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: White/Asian = 73.4%
- Average fall to fall 3rd to 4th year retention 2010 2017: White/Asian = 66.8%




Fall-to-fall retention of underrepresented minority males has fluctuated over the ten-year period examined. The highest first year retention rate occurred with the 2018 cohort (78.7%). The lowest retention rate in the same period was 55.0% in 2010. Additional research should be conducted to better understand retention in this population.


Second to third year retention (fall-to-fall) of underrepresented minority males lags behind that of white males and the cohort average in eight of the nine years examined. Second to third year retention has fluctuated significantly over the nine-year period examined. Additional research should be conducted to better understand retention in this population.

Third to fourth year retention (fall-to-fall) of underrepresented minority males is lower than the retention rate for white males and the cohort average in seven of the eight years examined. Third to fourth year retention has fluctuated significantly over the eight-year period examined. Additional research should be conducted to better understand retention in this population.



Study Abroad & Retention


One of the signature features of an Arcadia education is our focus on study abroad. As the charts below illustrate, students who decide to participate in the First-Year Study Abroad Experience (FYSAE) or Preview retain at much higher levels (20-30% higher) than students who chose not to participate in either program.

- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: FYSAE = 86.2%
- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: Preview = 87.5%
- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: Neither FYSAE or Preview = 64.2%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: FYSAE = 79.8%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: Preview = 80.5%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: Neither FYSAE or Preview = 55.2%
- Average fall to fall 3rd to 4th year retention 2010 2017: FYSAE = 70.6%
- Average fall to fall 3rd to 4th year retention 2010 2017: Preview = 73.4%


Study Abroad & 1,2, & 3-Year Retention Rates


Honors Program Participation & Retention

The chart below examines year to year retention rates for FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS (FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE) cohorts for students enrolled in the Honors program in fall 2010 to fall 2019, compared to students not enrolled in the program. Historical data shows that Honors students are more likely to retain than non-Honors students, averaging 11.5 percent higher for Year 1 retention.


- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: Honors = 88.9%
- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: Non-Honors = 77.4%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: Honors = 85.2%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: Non-Honors = 69.3%
- Average fall to fall 3rd to 4th year retention 2010 2017: Honors = 74.4%
- Average fall to fall 3rd to 4th year retention 2010 2017: Non-Honors = 63.1%

Honors & 1,2, & 3-Year Retention Rates


Year 1 to Year 2 Retention - Honors

Year 3 to Year 4 Retention - Honors




The chart below examines year to year retention rates for FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS (FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE) cohorts by Pell status from fall 2010 to fall 2019. Historical data shows that students receiving Pell grants are more likely to retain at a lower rate. On average, Pell students retain 3.7% less than Non-Pell from first to second year. By the third year, the retention gap grows to an average of 5.7%.

- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2019: Pell Grant Recipients = 76.5%
- Average fall to fall 1st to 2nd year retention 2010 2018: Non-Pell = 80.2%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: Pell Grant Recipients = 68.6%
- Average fall to fall 2nd to 3rd year retention 2010 2018: Non-Pell = 72.8%
- Average fall to fall 3rd to 4th year retention 2010 2017: Pell Grant Recipients = 60.8%
- Average fall to fall 3rd to 4th year retention 2010 2017: Non-Pell = 66.5%


First-Year Student Cohort 1, 2, & 3-Year Retention Rates & Pell Grants



Trends in Graduation Rates

After reaching a peak 6-year Graduation Rate of 70.5% with the fall 2012 cohort, graduation rates have begun trending down closer to normal levels. The average 4-year Graduation Rate for Arcadia University is 58.4%, with the 6-year Graduation Rate averaging 64.6%.

Gender & Graduation Rates

The charts below examine graduation rates for FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS (FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE) cohorts by gender from fall 2009 to fall 2016. Historical data shows that male students are more likely to graduate at a lower rate than female students.

- Average 4-Year Graduation Rate 2009 2016: Men = 52.2%
- Average 5-Year Graduation Rate 2009 2015: Men = 62.1%
- Average 6-Year Graduation Rate 2009 2014: Men = 60.1%
- Average 4-Year Graduation Rate 2009 2016: Women = 61.1%



Race Ethnicity, Gender & Graduation Rates

The chart below shows that there are stark differences between male and female Underrepresented Minority and non-Underrepresented Minority students. The highest 4-year graduation rates are among Non-Underrepresented Minority females. Historical data shows that Underrepresented Minority males graduate at the lowest 4-year rate, though in more recent cohorts that gap is closing. In the fall 2009 cohort, the difference between Non-Underrepresented Minority males and Underrepresented Minority males was 27%. With the 2016 cohort, the gap had dropped to 14%. While numbers are improving, there is still work that needs to be done to close this gap.




4-year Graduation Rates, Pell Grants

6-YearGraduation Rates: Pell Recipients




Transfer Student Retention Rates

Year 1 retention for Transfer students at Arcadia nearly mirrors the retention rate for FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS (FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE) students, averaging 79.1% between fall 2010 and fall 2019. The biggest loss of transfer students typically occurs between the 2nd and 3rd year, with students either graduating with a degree from Arcadia or moving on to another college or university.








Graduate Student Retention Rates




Graduate Student Graduation Rates

Full-time Graduate students continue to graduate from Arcadia at high levels, with most full-time students completing their program within 3 years of entering Arcadia. Since 2015, 95% of full-time students who started full-time in their program completed within 3 years. In contrast, Graduate students that start part-time take longer to complete their programs. During this same period, only 61.9% of part-time Graduate students completed their program within 3 years.
